

1 Corinthians 10:12-21

**A Communion Study**

- 1A** *On the basis of the Israel's wilderness journey, where many died in sin, beware, 12:* So the one who assumes to stand, let him **watch** lest he fall.
- 2A** *The escapability of temptation, v.13:*
- 1B** *The divine limit on temptation, 13a:* No temptation has taken you except human;
- 2B** *The person of God, 13b:* but God is faithful,
- 3B** *The divine limit on temptation, 13c:* Who does not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able,
- 4B** *The divine provision in temptation, 13d:* but He will also make the egress together with the temptation, for you to be able to bear up.
- 3A** *The specific action item in the realm of idol worship, 14:* On which account, my beloved, flee from idolatry.
- 4A** *The nature of Paul's speech and call to examine his teaching, 15:* I speak as to a sensible man, judge yourselves what I say.
- 5A** *The nature of the communion ritual, vv.16-17:*
- 1B** *The nature of the cup and bread, 16* The cup of blessing which we bless, isn't it fellowship of the blood of the Christ? The bread which we break, isn't it fellowship of the body of the Christ?
- 2B** *Unity through the communion, 17:* Because one bread, one body, we are many; for we all partake from the one bread.
- 6A** *The illustration of Israel, 18:* Look at Israel according to the flesh; aren't those who eat the sacrifices partakers of the altar?
- 7A** *A call to examine the substance of idolatry, 19:* What am I saying then? That an idol is something? Or that an idol-sacrifice is something?
- 8A** *The true nature of Gentile sacrifice, 20:* But that the things which the Gentiles sacrifice they sacrifice to demons, and not to God.
- 9A** *Paul's desire for the Corinthian believers, 20a:* But I do not want you to become partners with demons,
- 1A** *The mutually exclusive realms of communion and Gentile sacrifice, 21* You are not able to drink the cup of the Lord and the cup of demons; you are not able to partake of the table of the Lord and the table of demons.
