

Revelation 11 Outline

1A The command to measure the temple of God, vv.1-2:

- 1B** Command to measure, 1: And there was given to me a reed like a measuring rod, saying, "Rise, and measure the temple of God, and the altar, and the worshippers in it.
- 2B** The prohibited section, 2: And leave out the court which is outside the temple, and do not measure it, because it was given to the Gentiles; and they will tread the holy city for forty two months.

2A The two witnesses, vv.3-14:

- 1B** Their length of ministry, 3: And I will give my two witnesses, and they will prophesy one thousand two hundred and sixty days, being clothed in sackcloth.
- 2B** Their identity, 4: These are the two olive trees, and the two lampstands who are standing before the Lord of the earth.
- 3B** Their protective powers, 5: And if anyone wants to harm them, fire proceeds from their mouth, and devours their enemies; and if anyone wants to harm them, thus it is necessary for him to be killed.
- 4B** Their authorities, 6: These have authority to close heaven, that no rain showers in the days of their prophecy; and they have authority over the waters, to turn them into blood, and to smite the earth with every plague as often as they want.
- 5B** Their deaths, 7: And when they finish their testimony, the beast that ascends from the abyss will make war with them, and conquer them, and kill them.
- 6B** Their corpses, vv.8-10:
 - 1C** The location of their corpses, 8: And their corpses in the street of the great city, which is called spiritually Sodom and Egypt, where also their Lord was crucified.
 - 2C** Their lying in view, 9: Then those from the peoples and tribes and tongues and nations will see their corpses for three and a half days, and they will not allow their corpses to be put into graves.
 - 3C** The mockery of the corpses, 10: And those who dwell upon the earth will rejoice over them, and cheer, and give gifts to each other, because these two prophets tormented those who dwell upon the earth.
- 7B** Their resuscitation, 11 And after three and a half days, the breath of life from God entered into them, and they stood upon their feet, and a great fear fell upon those who beheld them.
- 8B** Their transfer to heaven, 12: And they heard a loud voice from heaven saying to them, "Come up here." And they came up to heaven on the cloud, and their enemies beheld them.

- 9B The earthquake, 13 And in that hour there came a great earthquake, and a tenth of the city fell, and in the earthquake were killed names of men, seven thousand; and the rest became fearful, and they gave glory to the God of heaven.
- 10B The declaration of the end of the second woe, 14: The second woe is past; the third woe, look, is coming quickly.
- 3A The blowing and declaration of the seventh angel, 15: And the seventh angel blew, and loud voice came in heaven, saying, "The kingdom of the world has come, of our Lord, and of His Christ, and He will reign forever and ever."
- 4A The praise of the twenty four elders, vv.16-19:
- 1B Their physical response, 16: And the twenty four elders who are sitting before the throne of God upon their thrones, fell upon their faces, and made obeisance to God,
- 2B Their praise to His power and sovereignty, 17: saying, "We thank You, Lord God almighty, the one who is and who was, because You have received your great power, and You reigned.
- 3B Their praise to His wrath and reward, 18: And the nations were angry, and Your wrath came, and the time of the dead to be judged, and to give reward to your servants the prophets and the holy ones and those who fear Your name, to the small and to the great, and to ruin those who ruin the earth.
- 5A The opening of the temple of God, 19: And the temple of God was opened, and the ark of the covenant of the Lord was seen in His temple. And there came lightnings and noises and thunders and great hail.
